discuss legislative updates from Washington, programs and services from her offices, and her policy agenda for the 115th Congress.

Fudge will also entertain questions about the Trump administration, and policy changes in general.

The federal lawmaker said that thoughts and concerns of her constituents are paramount and that she invites the public to the community forum.

The forum comes on the heels of unrest relative to policies by President Donald Trump regarding his on-hold temporary Muslim ban, his efforts to derail abortion rights and Obamacare initiatives with support from congressional Republicans, and other matters impacting Blacks and other minorities, senior citizens, immigrants, women, the LGBT community, and children.

Pro-President Donald Trump organizers have scheduled a protest in downtown Cleveland on March 4, less than a week after the aforementioned
